The Winnebago Land Homeless & Housing Coalition plan to connect people experiencing homelessness in Winnebago Land area to emergency services and the coordinated entry system after business hours of 5:00 PM to 8:00 AM and weekends. We would like to ensure individuals and families in our community have reasonable access to shelter 24 hours a day.

If someone needs shelter after business hours, they are referred to the appropriate shelter for their demographic. Referring individuals include agency staff, police officers, school social workers, outreach workers, etc.

Green Lake County:

There are no emergency shelters in Green Lake County. Motel vouchers have been given to the Police/Sheriff's Departments to use to shelter the individual for the night with directions to contact ADVOCAP for assessment for coordinated entry the following business day. ADVOCAP has limited grant funding for this purpose and communicated the procedure with law enforcement.

General activities:

Staff will discuss natural supports for housing to divert (rapid resolution) from shelter.

If rapid resolution is not possible and a bed is available, an intake is completed, and they are housed.

The individual or family will be connected to the coordinated entry system the next business day by shelter staff.

The Winnebagoland Housing Coalition reviews and approves the After-Hours Plan annually each December. The After-Hours Plan is distributed to coalition members annually. In addition, the plan is communicated to others in the community who encounter individuals or families in need of shelter, such as Outreach Workers, Police Departments, School Social Workers, etc.
