1. Rapid Rehousing/Homeless Prevention Grant Update-

CAP Services is not reapplying for this grant so it will done as of June 30, 2017. The funds for this grant cycle are almost depleted and will most likely be used by December. CAP Services assisted 11 households with Rapid Rehousing and 11 households with homeless prevention. So after the grant is done, it was asked where we can refer people who are homeless. We came up with some ideas:

- DHS Salvation Army \$ (1st month's rent and utility disconnect) 1x/year, allotted \$300 for rent and \$200 for utilities but looking at increasing amounts.
- DHS United Way \$ very limited.
- Family Crisis Center It is a domestic abuse shelter but has a license for runaway youth and youth in crisis.
- UMOS if you have worked in the agricultural field.
- Local churches
- ThedaCare Foundation maybe
- Operation Round up with Adams Columbia
- Rural housing WI Rural Housing website (http://www.wisconsinruralhousing.org/)
- FEMA \$ Waushara Industries
- Veteran's Office has money for veterans.

2. Homeless Situation in Wautoma School District -

Jeff was asked to share a story about an 18-year old student who was homeless and was looking for a place to stay. It sounds common for parents with adult students to argue and then, parents kick them out. This student was able to relocate to a different area but it seems like this happens quite often.

3. Miscellaneous

DHS will allow homeless individuals to use their address in order to get mail. Jill came up with a list of shelters in the area.
