Increase funding for case management services.


Case management provides coordinated services that are far more effective at addressing both surface needs and the underlying causes of homelessness.

Authorize WHEDA and encourage Public Housing Authorities to prioritize vouchers for people experiencing homelessness.

Overall support for Governor Walker's proposed budget providing new resources to end homelessness.

Central CoC

This local homeless coalition includes all of Adams, Columbia, Dodge, Juneau, and Sauk counties. According to the US Census Bureau (2015), the estimated population is 255,259 with 21% under the age of 18.
