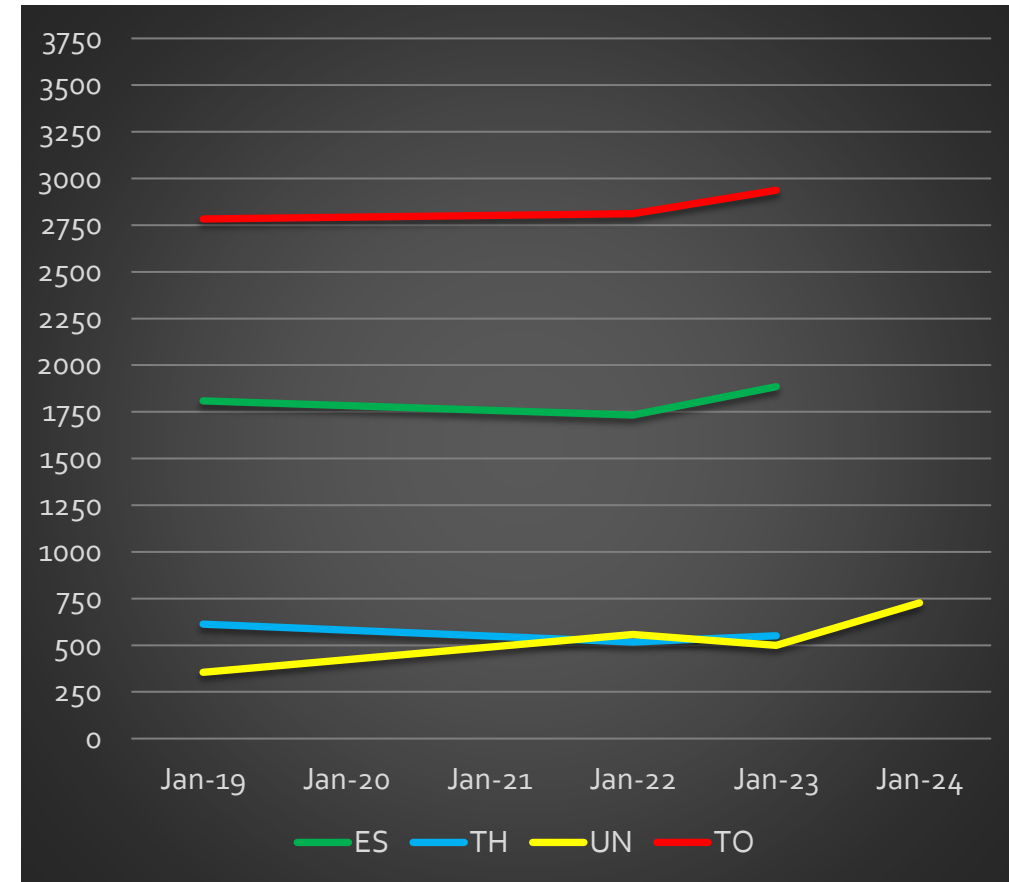

Point-in-Time – Unsheltered

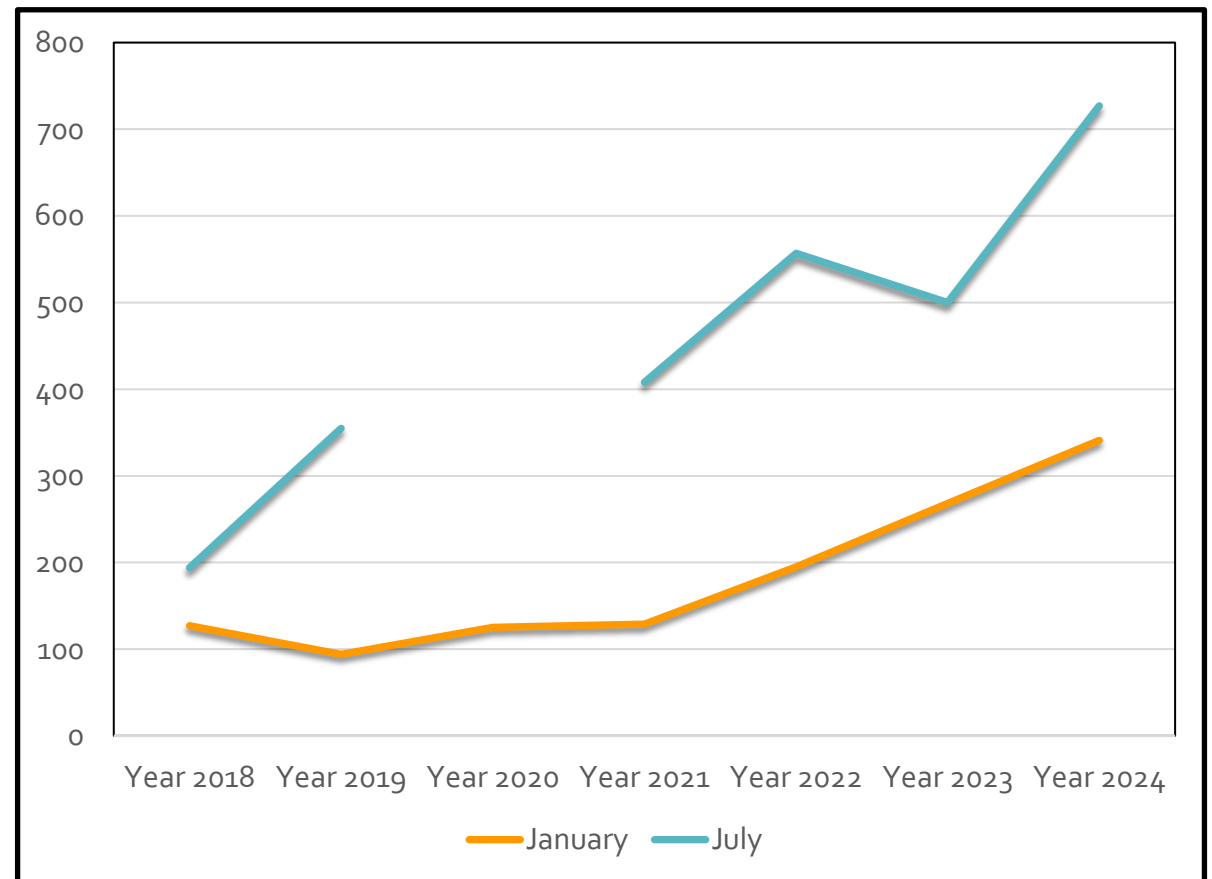

Definitions



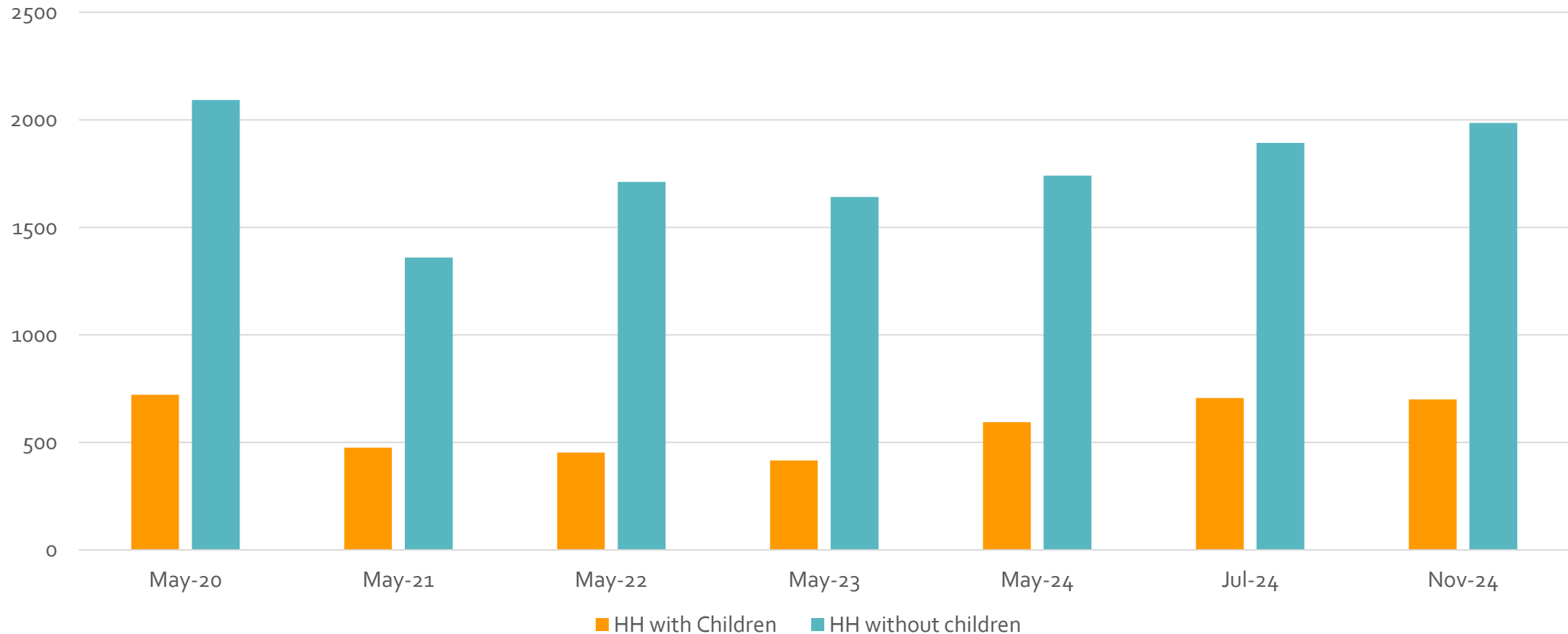
- **CH = Meets Chronic Homeless Definition**
 - Disability
 - Category 1 homeless situation (place not meant for human habitation or shelter)
 - Homeless for 12 consecutive months or 4 times within 3 years that totals 12 months

- **CH – 2nd priority = does not meet chronic homeless definition**
 - Disability
 - Category 1 homeless situation (place not meant for human habitation or shelter)
 - Homeless for 12 non-consecutive months or less than 4 times within 3 years

- **RRH w/ICM (intensive case management) = does not meet chronic homeless definition**
 - Disability, less than 12 months of homelessness AND
 - Without a disability, 12 months or more of homelessness

- **RRH = does not meet chronic homeless definition**
 - Without a disability, less than 12 months of homelessness

Homelessness by Household Type

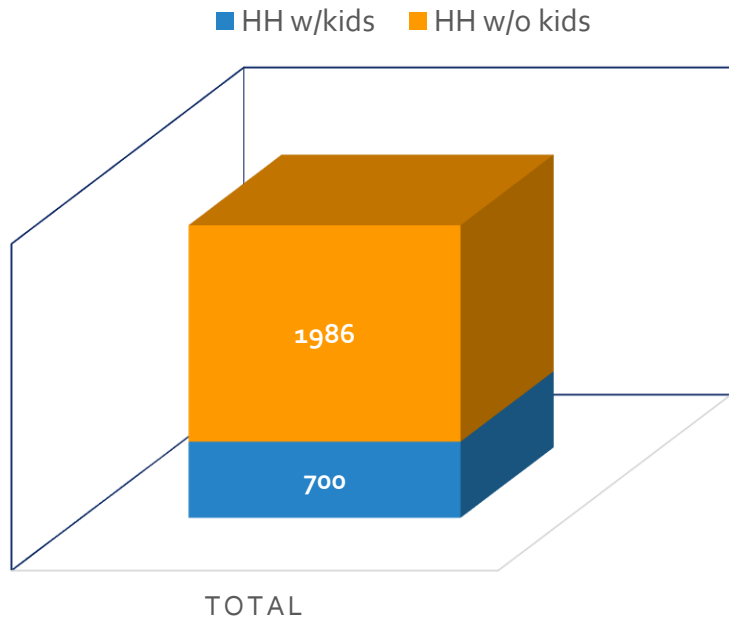

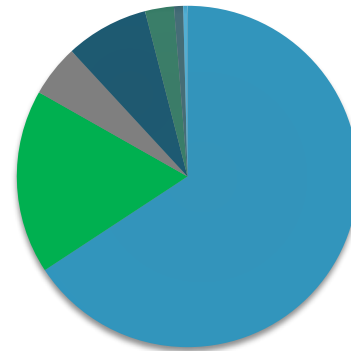
Coordinated Entry - Demographics

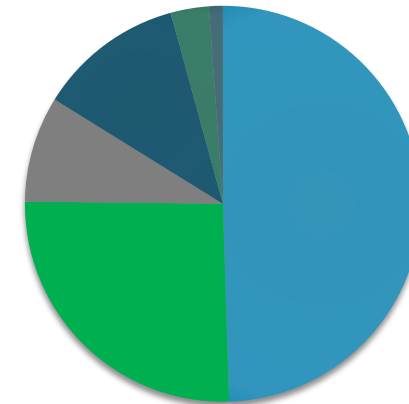

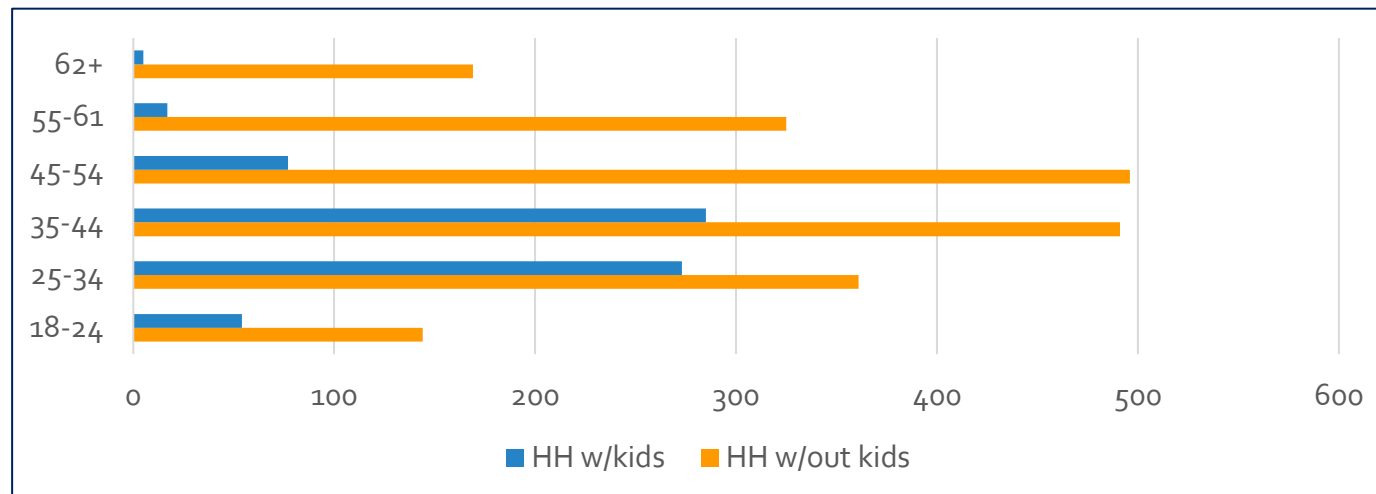

 - 2 pts = increase in income from employment or rate was 20% or higher
 - 2 pts = increase from non-employment source or rate was 50% or higher

- In CoC competition, max was 3 points. 1 point if there was a reduction in the first-time homeless number 😊

Measure 7: Successful Placement or Retention of Permanent Housing

- This is only for CoC funded projects.
- In CoC competition, max was 13 points.
 - 6 pts = metric (1) increase rate by at least 2% points or the rate was 50% or higher
 - 3 pts = metric (2) increase rate by at least 1% point or the rate was 96% or higher

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CRIMINALIZATION OF HOMELESSNESS

- We will be collecting and reviewing each coalition's regional plan to address criminalization of homelessness.
- The plan should include specific strategies for educating and engaging at least:
 - Local policymakers – city council, county board, city staff
 - Law enforcement – sheriff department and police departments
 - Local businesses – chamber of commerce, main street, business improvement districts
- The plan should include proactive steps to stand against criminalizing ordinances, policies, and practices. This includes but is not limited to:
 - Camping bans
 - Panhandling ordinances
 - Clearing of encampments
 - Other tickets given specifically because someone is existing outside
