Purpose and Focus of American Rescue Plan - Homeless Children & Youth Funds

- ARP-HCY funds are specifically dedicated to support the identification, enrollment, and school participation of children and youth experiencing homelessness, including through wrap-around services.
- U.S. Dept. of Education also emphasized that districts should analyze the needs
 of students experiencing homelessness and use funds for "other extraordinary
 or emergency assistance needed to enable homeless children and youths to
 attend school and participate fully in school activities."

Overview of ARP-HCY funds

- Overall, costs must be "reasonable and necessary" and align with the purpose of, and other requirements in, the Education for Homeless Children and Youth statute.
- Districts should also consider the extraordinary impact of the pandemic on students experiencing homelessness, including academic, social, emotional and mental health needs.
- Funds can be used through September 2024.

Use of Funds

- Increase outreach and identification
- Enhance communication options with students and families
- Partner with Community-Based Organizations or hire "systems navigators" to help families and youth access wrap-around services
- Provide academic coaching, enrichment opportunities, and access to summer learning
- Offer early childhood education services for young children experiencing homelessness
- Help meet rising mental health needs
- Increase counseling and social work services
- Provide more transportation options
- Providing emergency short-term housing for families experiencing homelessness

3-year Innovation Grant

Purpose is to go above and beyond McKinney-Vento law, districts encouraged to focus on academic achievement of students experiencing homelessness

3 year grant cycle
Open to all school districts in the state

2-year Compliance Grant

Purpose is to help districts get into compliance and to prepare districts to apply for the 3-year innovation grant

2 year grant cycle Open to all school districts in the state
