# **Welcome & Introductions**

The meeting via Zoom was called to order at 8:32 a.m. by Byron Wright. Byron welcomed everyone and went through roll call.

# Minutes

A motion was made by Sharon P. and seconded by Pam H. to approve the minutes. All in favor, motion carried.

#### **Presentation – Point In Time**

Veronica J. let the group know that Carrie Poser, Director of the Balance of State came and made a presentation and presented data to show how we are doing here in Kenosha. Additionally, she provided information comparing a variety of data from 2019 and 2020, including shelter demographics, movement in shelter, people served, coordinated entry data, etc. Carrie also discussed the rapid rehousing information for Kenosha and also information on how to view our systems from various aspects. Kenosha's 2021 point in time information will be provided to the group shortly.

The ESN Meeting was temporarily adjourned to adjourn the quarterly meeting of the Emergency Food and Shelter Program.

Byron called the meeting of the Emergency Food and Shelter Program to order. Lisa H. reported that for Phase 38, the agencies receiving funding have completed their LRO certifications and have received their first payments. A plan for monitoring will be discussed over the next few months as this is a requirement for funding.

There being no further business of the EFSP, Sharon P. made a motion to adjourn, Tamarra C. seconded, all were in favor, the meeting was adjourned.

### **EHH Update**

Lisa reported that although we still do not have much information, every year the ESN needs to vote on a lead agency. A motion was made by Pam H. and seconded by Sharon P. to make KHDS the lead agency. All were in favor, motion carried.

# Money being received by Kenosha City – Home Funds

Byron mentioned that Kenosha will be receiving \$2M in funds for affordable housing. He is suggesting the housing committee get together to discuss what they would like to see done with that money and then connect with those at the city level to voice what is really needed by our consumers. Lisa also mentioned it may be interesting to find out what other communities are doing with these funds. She will send out something to gain some information regarding this.

### **Committee Reports**

Homeless Awareness & Prevention Partnership/Centralized and Coordinated Assessment Committee Veronica J. reported the committee did not meet, instead took part in the presentation by Carrie Poser on the March 16 meeting date. The next meeting is April 20.

#### **Public Relations Committee**

Sherri D. reported the committee met on March 31. An invite was created to expand this group a bit to consumers as well as other agencies and partners. This invite went to Karl to review, once finalized this will be sent to the ESN members to invite others to become part of this group. Also, the MOU that we currently use is quite old and therefore before 2022, the MOU will be reviewed and revised to better reflect the needs of this group. Additionally, we will be updating the brochure. It has been a while since this has been done and our committee felt we should have some type of information source. Sharon P. mentioned she has the Word version of the last version of the brochure if it would be helpful and will send it to Sherri D. Tamarra C. then mentioned that she has some business cards that have ESN information and the 2-1-1 information on them that she thought would be good for the PR committee to distribute. Tamarra will get them to Sherri. Cyndi Z. made a motion to approve the report, Sharon P. seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

### **BOS/COC Update**

Lisa H. told the group there are a few major changes. The first is as of March 31, ended our access to SharePoint and have been going through a transition ever since. The go live data was supposed to be April 15, but may be later since a lot of data had to be entered manually. Coordinated entry will more than likely not be up and running until August. Lisa then reported that they have done two elections and she officially accepted the position of chair.

# **Agency Sharing**

- ➤ Karl E. indicated that the summer camp will be moving forward at Brass. If you know of any teens or college students who would be interested in a part-time summer job have them visit the ELCA website, it would be a seven week commitment.
- Laurie mentioned the virtual community resource fair series that started in January continues. The fourth one is today and is focused on financial resources and budgeting. This is a great way to stay connected to the community and these fairs are available after the fact if you are unable to make it on the actual day. May's topic is addiction recovery is possible.
- ➤ Sharon P. let the group know that she has been chairing the Criminalization of Homelessness committee. There was a suggestion that came out of this committee that a quarterly report be provided to the Human Service committee. This will be done through the HAP committee.
- Abby from Familia Dental reminded the group about the community baby shower at YMCA, Sunday, May 16, 1-3 p.m. They will have speakers, will be raffling off car seats. If you want to put flyers in the bags that are handed out just get the flyers to Abby. They will be giving away diapers and other items. A flyer will be forthcoming.
- Sean Merchant indicated the agency he is affiliated with has undergone a name change. They are now Veterans Path to Hope (formerly TLS Veterans). Since 1996, Veterans Path to Hope has been in the Northern Counties of Illinois and we needed to recalibrate since we outgrew the transitional living services originally out of Hebron, IL. We have a wealth of other services such as clothing, food, and also provides grants to provide housing, rent, etc. Many other services are also available to the veteranspathtohope.org is the website and the new phone number (815) 321-HOPE
- Molly from UMOS indicated they have a drive-thru event at the Job Center on April 30. If you have information you would like in the packets please let Molly know.
