The Balance of State Continuum of Care is a 501c3 non-profit organization that provides leadership to local homeless coalitions in 69 counties across the State of Wisconsin, excluding Dane, Milwaukee, and Racine counties.

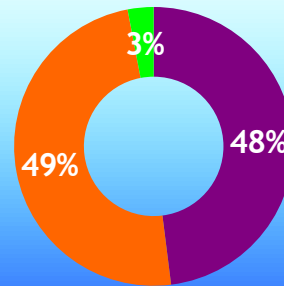

SOLUTIONS

1 Remove statutory language hindering local control of state funds, and instead base funding on need and performance.

2 Authorize WHEDA and encourage Public Housing Authorities to prioritize vouchers for people experiencing homelessness.

3 Increase funding for case management services. Case management provides coordinated services that are far more effective at addressing both surface needs and the underlying causes of homelessness.

4 Overall support for Governor Walker's proposed budget providing new resources to end homelessness.
