<u>Scott Webb</u> is a trauma survivor himself who has worked in the behavioral health field for 30 years. His career has included clinical, administrative and consultative work. Prior to his position with the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Scott worked for a national employee assistance firm managing a national book business providing onsite trauma response services across the United States. Scott is currently the State Trauma Informed Coordinator. He holds a Master of Science in Education degree from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh and is a licensed clinical social worker.
