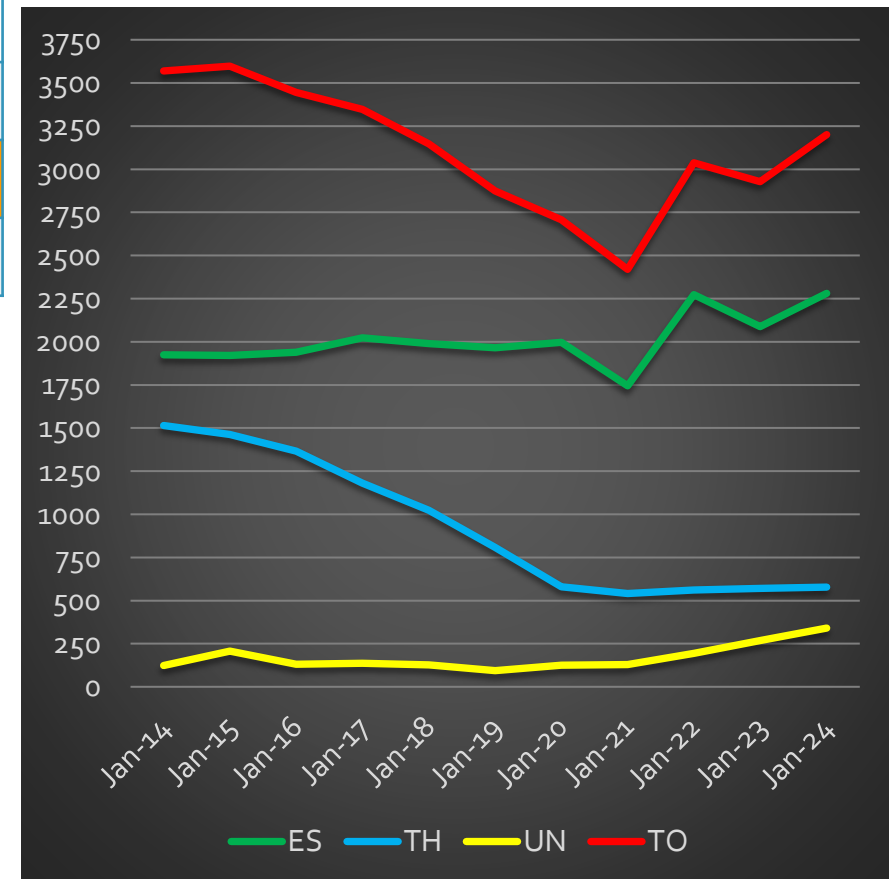

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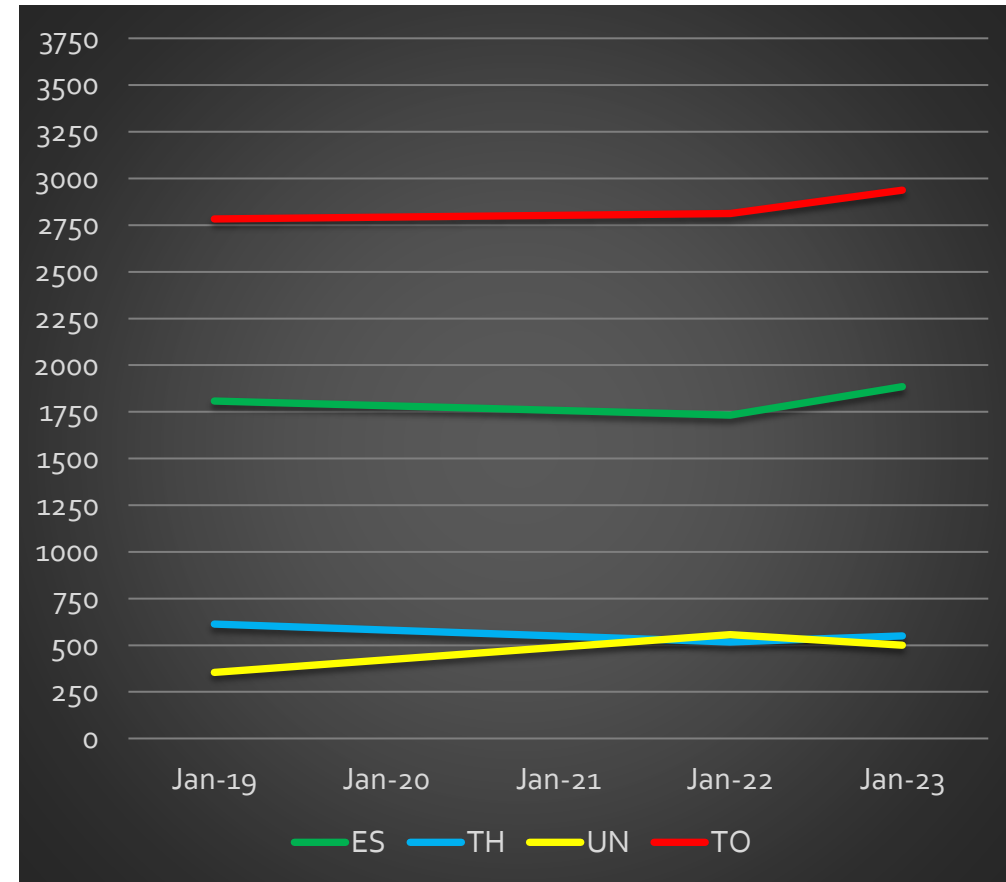

Point-in-Time – Unsheltered

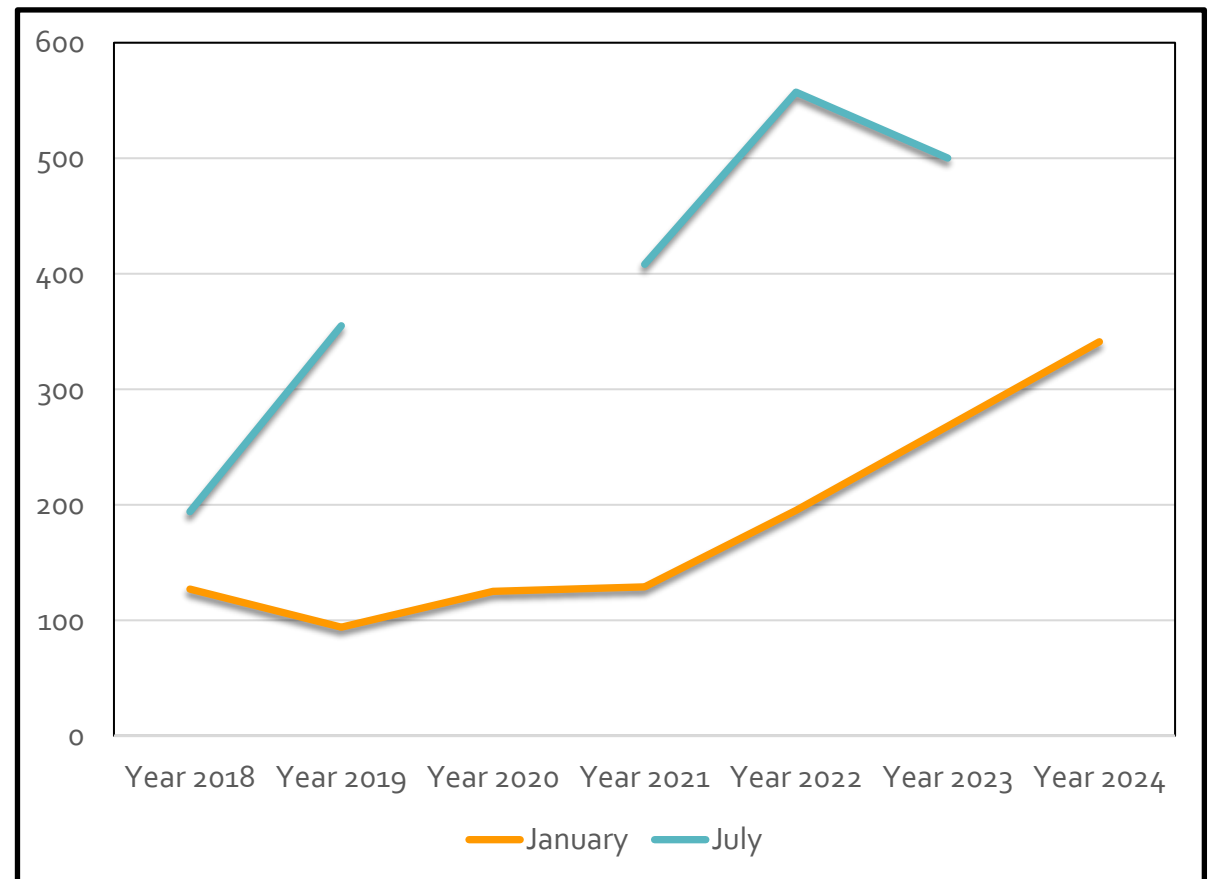

Definitions



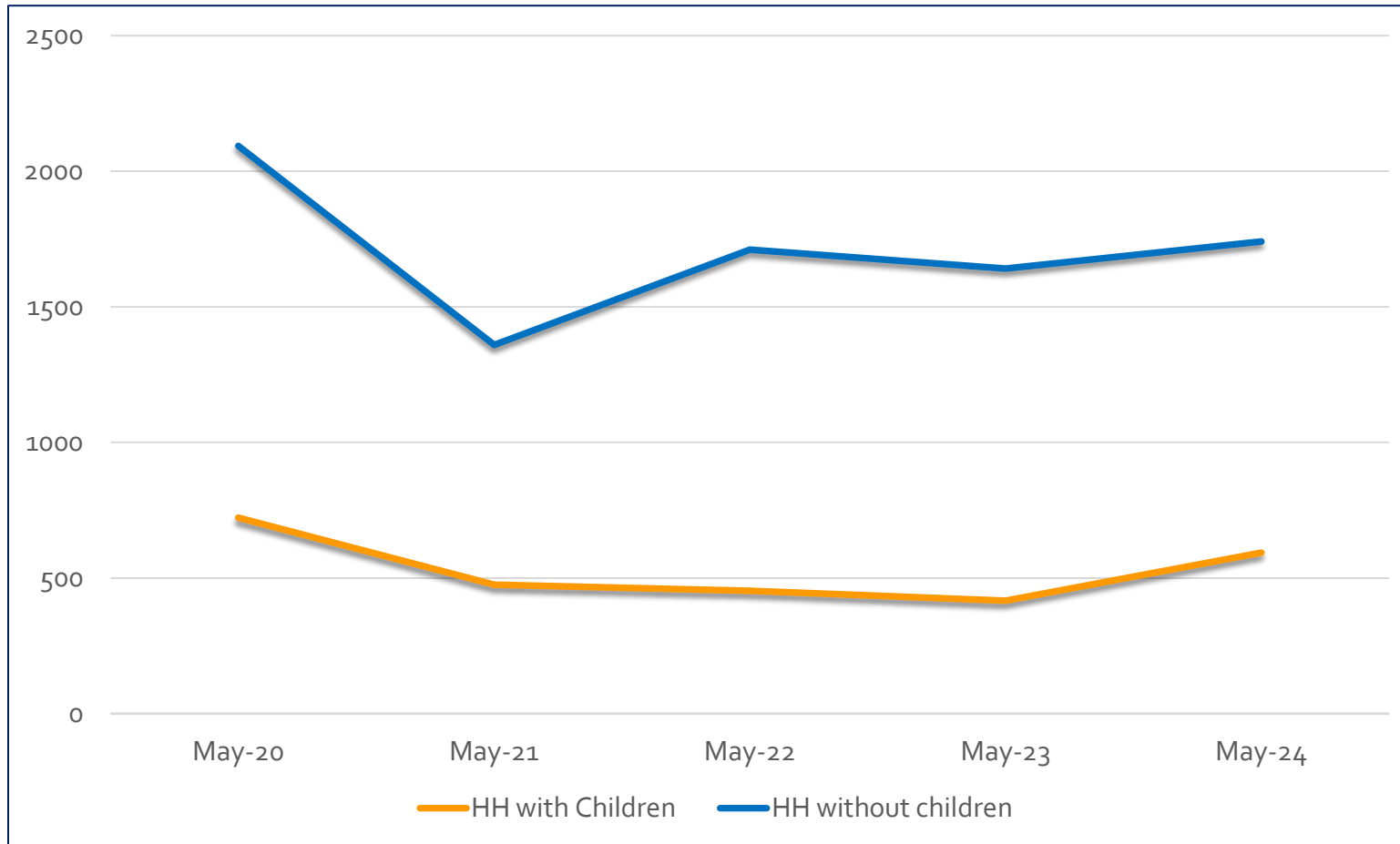
- **CH = Meets Chronic Homeless Definition**
 - Disability
 - Category 1 homeless situation (place not meant for human habitation or shelter)
 - Homeless for 12 consecutive months or 4 times within 3 years that totals 12 months

- **CH – 2nd priority = does not meet chronic homeless definition**
 - Disability
 - Category 1 homeless situation (place not meant for human habitation or shelter)
 - Homeless for 12 non-consecutive months or less than 4 times within 3 years

- **RRH w/ICM (intensive case management) = does not meet chronic homeless definition**
 - Disability, less than 12 months of homelessness AND
 - Without a disability, 12 months or more of homelessness

- **RRH = does not meet chronic homeless definition**
 - Without a disability, less than 12 months of homelessness

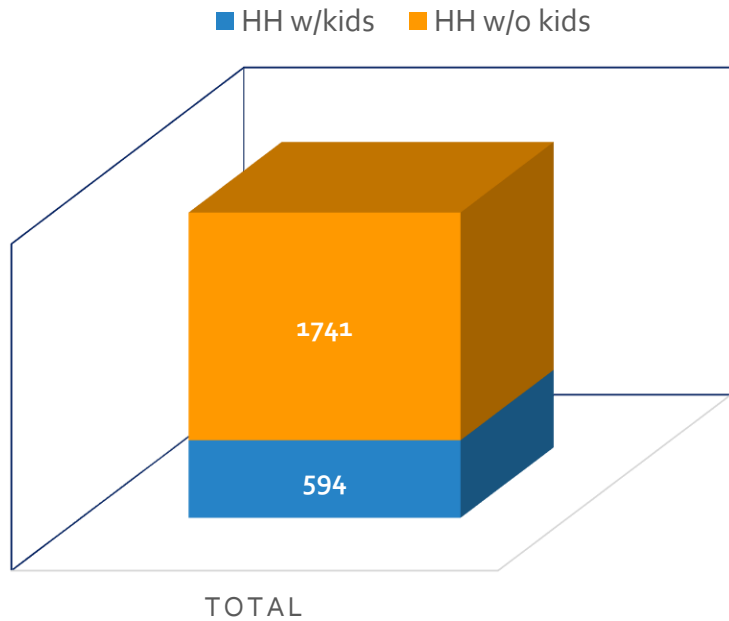

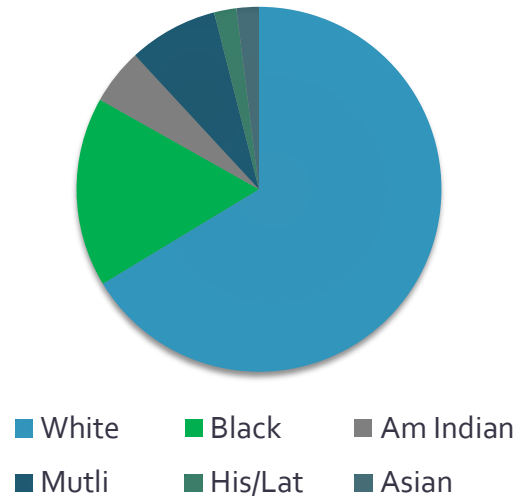

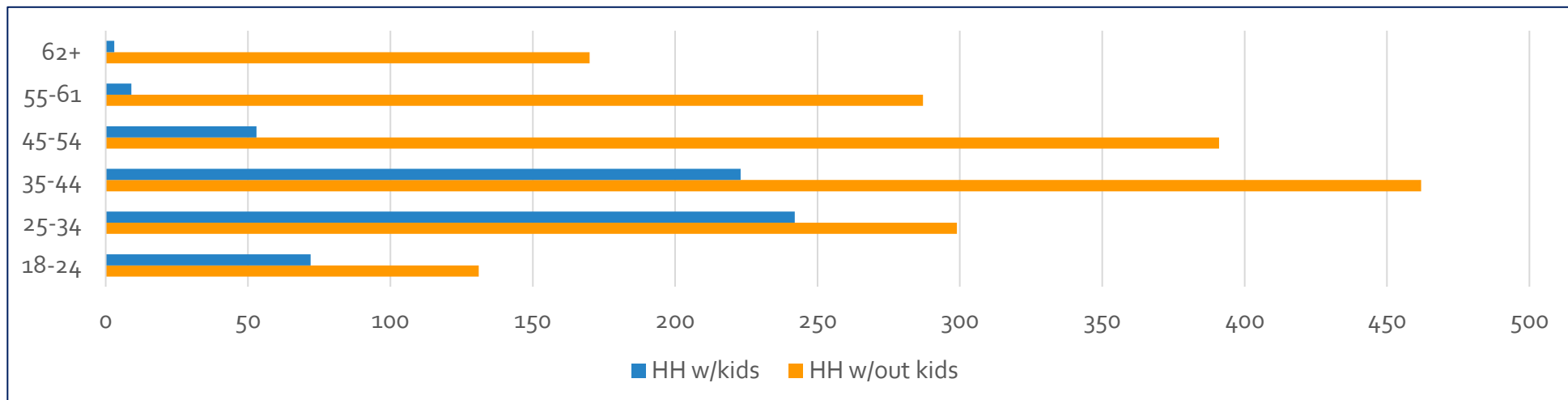

2024 Landscape



• Federal

- US Supreme Court heard oral arguments on *Grants Pass vs. Johnson* on April 22, 2024.
 - The case was originally filed in 2018, lower court determined it is cruel and unusual punishment to arrest or ticket people sleeping outside when they have no other safe place to go.
- Federal Funding & Federal Policies
- Elections have consequences (Fall 2024)
 - Wisconsin Senator race
 - All 8 Congressional Seats (House of Rep)
 - State Assembly
 - State Senate

- **Wisconsin**

- Cicero-supported legislation in 2023 was approved by Assembly & did not go to the floor of the Senate: “Pay for Performance & Sanctioned Encampments”
 - Assembly Bill 689 - <https://docs.legis.wisconsin.gov/2023/proposals/ab689>
 - Only 4 Assembly Republicans voted against the bill: Scott Allen (Waukesha), David Armstrong (Rice Lake), Jessie Rodriguez (Oak Creek), and Shae Sortwell (Two Rivers)
 - Senate Bill 669 - <https://docs.legis.wisconsin.gov/2023/proposals/sb669>
- Wisconsin Legislature operates in a biennial (two year) session that lasts from early January of the odd numbered year to early January of the odd numbered year two years later. (Jan 23-Jan 25).
 - Elections this fall. New maps. Who was, who will be = <https://maps.legis.wisconsin.gov/?version=2022>
 - Opportunity for advocacy & education

- **Balance of State CoC**
