Updates BOS, Budget was approved. Board members were ceded. Shared Housing training sign up running out of time:

HMIS Updates: EGC extra dollars, presentation Millie can send out. When finalized it will be sent out with application.

Carrie will be sending out an email on Racial Disparity based on homeless in the area and state. HMIS licensing. Security training by the end of the year for all Clarity users. Agencies with monitoring have information due by the 30th of November. Millie will send her NWCSA when she has it sorted.

HDC new program and Tanya will present. Information is in these meeting notes. Tanya will screen share as well as powerpoint emailed to all. At Risk Advocacy Program serving ages 12-21. Runaway Services, Street Outreach, Basic Center Program, 24 Teen Hotline & New additions: Drop in center & human trafficking.

Provide crisis intervention & advocacy to runaway youth. Offer mediation services to youth and/or families. Stabilization included meeting basic needs, safety planning, linkages to school & community resources and treatment referrals. Parent permission is required for youth center stays.

2021 Runaway reports 16 reports, all different youth. Some families do not report, so numbers may be higher.

Connect youth & young adults, they have a higher risk of being exploited and/or trafficked. Provide outreach services in the community; parks, skate parks, Schools & library etc. Tabling is also done with information from CASDA. Hygiene supplies are given, backpacks worn by staff & volunteers are all the same to make it easier for the youth to find them.

Center Program provides crisis intervention, case management & referrals. PRO supports life-skills, stable housing, jobs, education assistance & numerous other connections. Referrals can come from anywhere.

Youth Services Framework: Vision - Youth Thrive, Principles - Right service at the right time, Outcomes - Education, employment & housing, Foundational Elements - Connections & well being.

Clothing, gas cards can also be given to help. Pros & Cons with safe places. They do work with Lifehouse but no other place in our community. They have a vehicle to help transport and

also will go with them as support. They will make referrals for mental health and substance abuse.

1-800-777-7844 or 715-394-9177 24 hour teen helpline. Runaways, other youth & young adults, parents, caregivers & friends needing support & information.

Drop in center: family style meal once a week, warm up foods option for rest of the week, food shelf, clothing closet, hygiene, onsite laundry & shower facility. Games, recreational activities, laptops, wifi, support groups and hands on activities. Crisis counselors and hours of operation are from 3-7pm Mon-Fri.

Tracy Henegar asks if it is just for runaways or all youth? All youth are welcome.

Human trafficking supportive services, new program: Samantha Rawn, Region 7 DCF grantee for anti-human trafficking. Access to health care, legal services, mental health, education & housing. Samantha will be doing training to become licensed. A lot of work to be done. She is the first grantee in WI. Working with Jen Stank who is doing referrals.

Congratulations to Krystal for being the new director of Harbor House Crisis Shelters!

Holly from SHA said the turnaround for housing vouchers is about 6 months, so get on the list as soon as they can.

Open House from Tanya Nelson Project Reachout:

Runaway and homeless youth living on the streets anywhere are vulnerable to many forms of abuse and exploitation, including violence and human trafficking. Project Reach Out at HDC provides supportive services to runaway, homeless, and at-risk youth ages 12 to 21. Young people who become homeless need housing, employment, education services, and support for their overall well being. Many young people run away from home because of their sexual orientation, an unplanned pregnancy, problems at school, or use of drugs or alcohol. Others have been exposed to abuse, sexual exploitation, domestic violence, or caregivers with mental health and/or substance abuse issues. Project Reach Out will be opening a youth drop-in center to all youth in need of crisis intervention, case management, and referral services. We will strive to meet their basic needs, such as warm food, a food shelf, clothes, laundry services, a place to shower, hygiene products, etc. We will provide a safe, warm, nonjudgmental atmosphere where youth can wait until we find formal and informal sheltering options. We will be offering prevention curriculums, support groups, art/crafts, and games. To best meet the needs of the youth in our area, we will collaborate with other agencies, nonprofits, and school systems in a multidisciplinary response team approach focusing on positive youth development and trauma informed care.

We are excited to invite you to come check out our new youth drop-in center on December 14th, 2022. Stop by anytime between 3:30 pm and 6:30 pm to take a tour. We will be serving light snacks and refreshments. We should have our updated teen crisis cards and brochures ready to hand out by then.
